

## **Maths:**

- Practice your **tables** – 2nd class keep practising your addition and subtractions tables and 3rd Class keep practising your multiplication and division tables. Do your tables games like The Clock or D'Oh if you have a dice.
- Continue in your Master Your Maths books, do the next two weeks and also the Friday tests.
- 2nd Class - Busy at Maths 2 - p130-135 Money- written activities can be done if possible. Counting on when giving change is an important skill, e.g. a pencil costs 82c and I give the shopkeeper a euro, what change will I receive? Count on from 82c to 85c (3c) then jump from 85c to 90c (5c) and then from 90c to 100c (10c) -  $3c+5c+10c=18c$
- 3rd Class Busy at Maths p144-150 Money and Pattern
- There are plenty of websites with games and activities to practise tables and other numeracy activities- Oxfordowl.co.uk -fun maths games and activities-select the relevant age, IXL Maths, topmarks.co.uk

### **Reading**







- 2<sup>nd</sup> class: Continue reading Library books, David Walliams audiobook (he is releasing one free each day), a book from Borrowbox App if you have a library card or a book from [www.oxfordowl.co.uk](http://www.oxfordowl.co.uk), Read a book/ short story to a sibling or family member
- 3<sup>rd</sup> class: Get Set continue and Library Books or alternatives as with 2<sup>nd</sup> class above
- Both classes can access some nice stories and reading activities on the CJ Fallon website, if you select 2nd or 3rd class and English and choose Rainbow Stage 2 or 3 anthologies it will bring up the book and you can do a story a week. There are written activities at the end of each story that you can choose from also if you wish.

### **Writing**













- Continue cursive handwriting books, it's important to keep up a little handwriting each week to maintain and improve our skills
- Take advantage of the free postcards from An Post and write a postcard to family or friends. An Post has a good website called [anpostschoolbag.ie](http://anpostschoolbag.ie) with interesting facts and activities about the post.

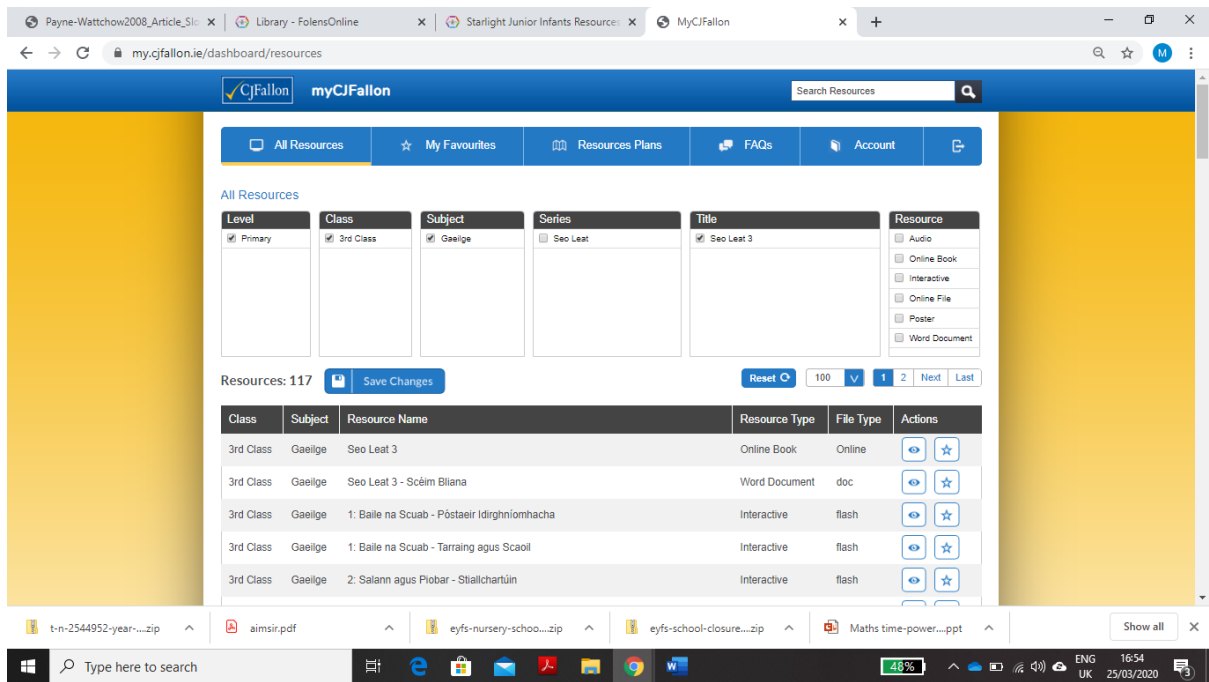
