Maths:

- Practice your <u>tables</u> 2nd class keep practising your addition and subtractions tables and 3rd Class keep practising your multiplication and division tables. Do your tables games like The Clock or D'Oh if you have a dice.
- Continue in your Master Your Maths books, do the next two weeks and also the Friday tests.
- Both classes: Topic for this week and next week is <u>3D shapes</u> and <u>Time</u>

We have already done some of these at school so this is a chance to go back over and practice or to learn something new. There are activities included for both classes but if 2^{nd} would like to try some of the 3^{rd} class work, please do. Alternatively, you can check your Busy At Maths in your book or on the CJ Fallon app for more work related to these topics.

3rd **Class**: the relevant pages on time (days, months, seasons) is pg 151-155 in your Busy At Maths.

2nd Class: the relevant pages in your Busy at Maths on time are 114-120. It is a good chance to go back over such an important topic! Pages 74-78 also deal with the months and seasons as well as the calendar.

- Project Work: some ideas for this are Space and the Planets, First Moon Landing.
